Elite Boxing Competition returns to "The Showplace of the South" in Spartanburg

oxing at the Depot will host the 2022 South Carolina Golden Gloves Boxing State Championship on June 17th and 18th at The Memorial Arena at Spartanburg Memorial Auditorium (385 North Church Street, Spartanburg, SC 29303). Golden Gloves has been contested in the Carolinas since 1934 and nationally since 1928. Boxers will compete for State Championship belts, All-State certificates signed by South Carolina Governor Henry Mc Master, and spots on South Carolina's Elite High Performance Boxing Team. There will be three competition divisions for men and women: Elite Open (18-40 years old; 11+ prior USA Boxing bouts); Novice (18-40 years old; 0-10 prior USA Boxing bouts); and Masters (40+ years old). Winners of the Elite Open Division will join Team South Carolina and travel to Birmingham, Alabama to compete in the Southeast Golden Gloves Tournament of Champions against the champions from Alabama, Georgia, North Carolina, and Tennessee. The winner of the Southeast Golden Gloves Tournament of Champions will then compete in the Golden Gloves National Championship. The following Olympic weight classes will be contested at this year's tournament:

Flyweight (112 lbs.), Featherweight (125 lbs.), Light Welterweight (139 lbs.), Welterweight (147 lbs.), Light Middleweight (156 lbs.), Middleweight (165 lbs.), Light Heavyweight (176 lbs.), Cruiserweight (189 lbs.), Heavyweight (203 lbs.), and Super Heavyweight (203+ lbs.).

The Memorial Arena will seat approximately 1,600 spectators each night, and fans will be treated to live concerts and dance performances in addition to boxing competition. Tickets are on sale now at Ticketmaster or at Spartanburg Memorial Auditorium's Box Office for \$12 (General Admission), \$22 (General Admission Floor), or \$32 (Ringside). All proceeds from the event will go to the SC Golden Gloves 501(c)(3) non-profit public charity, which currently offers a variety of free education programs developed by experts at Johns Hopkins University. South Carolina Golden Gloves 501(c)(3) Non-Profit Public Charity

SC Golden Gloves is a **501(c)(3) non-profit organization** with the purpose of improving the sport of boxing by setting the standard of excellence in boxing education, research, and practice.

SC Golden Gloves:

- (1) educates boxers, coaches, officials, and the public on boxing topics;
- (2) conducts boxing-related research; and
- (3) provides athlete-centered training and competitive opportunities.

In partnership with Johns Hopkins University, the SC Golden Gloves Neuro-Learning Initiative launched in 2020 in order to bridge the gap between brain sciences, learning sciences, and boxing practice. Experts at Johns Hopkins University and SC Golden Gloves began translating the latest neuroscience, neurology, neuroimaging, cognitive science, psychology, learning science, and educational research into practical recommendations for boxers, parents, coaches, and other key stakeholders in the boxing community.

SC Golden Gloves is making the sport of boxing safer.

SC Golden Gloves is committed to continuous improvement using an improvement science approach. In 2021, SC Golden Gloves:

- partnered with emergency responders to provide boxing coaches and athletes American Red Cross cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) and automated external defibrillator (AED) certification through hands-on training at a boxing gym.
- synthesized a hundred years of boxing-specific research and delivered the first sport specific chronic traumatic encephalopathy (CTE) course designed specifically to improve coaches' management of boxers' long term brain health.
- created, implemented, and evaluated a nutrition course covering the physical, mental, and emotional dangers of rapid weight loss ("rapid weight cutting") and provided information on how to safely manage weight loss and hydration in a weight class sport.
- conducted a statewide mixed methods needs assessment study consisting of gym observations, surveys, and interviews to explore ways in which to make amateur boxing safer in South Carolina.
- published boxing-related research at Johns Hopkins University's Sheridan Libraries.

A Brief History of Golden Gloves

n 1923, the Chicago Tribune created and staged a city wide boxing tournament. The event was initially scheduled for three days, but, due to 424 boxers entering and the tremendous popularity of the event with fans, the tournament lasted six days. All profits from the event went to disabled war veterans. The event grew and the first Golden Gloves Tournament of Champions took place in 1928 between Team Illinois and Team New York at the New York Coliseum. Once again, the event was a huge success, and all proceeds were donated to disabled war veterans.

Golden Gloves began in the Carolinas in 1934. The structure of the tournaments and rules have changed over the years to align with the national governing body rules, but the premise remains the same: Determine the best boxer in the state of South Carolina in each weight class through a multi-day, singleelimination tournament. Winners in each weight class become State Champion and are selected to represent South Carolina against other states' champions in the Southeast Golden Gloves Tournament of Champions (including champions from Alabama, Georgia, North Carolina, South Carolina, Tennessee). The winner of the Southeast tournament then advances to compete in the Golden Gloves National Tournament of Champions.

The South Carolina Golden Gloves have been hosted by Boxing at the Depot (209A Depot St., Greer, SC) since 2019. The tournaments sold out each year, and fans were delighted by the blend of high-level boxing competition, live musical performances, dance shows, and entertainment acts.

Where does partnership money go?


